THE EPISTLE

(For the Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost)

The Lord is my strength and my song.

The Lord has chastened me severely.

The Reading from the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians. (9:2-12)

Brethren, you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord. This is my defense to those who would examine me. Do we not have the right to our food and drink? Do we not have the right to be accompanied by a wife, as the other apostles and the brothers of the Lord and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working for a living? Who serves as a soldier at his own expense? Who plants a vine-yard without eating any of its fruit? Who tends a flock without getting some of the milk? Do I say this on human authority? Does not the law say the same? For it is written in the Law of Moses, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it is treading out the grain." Is it for oxen that God is concerned? Does he not speak entirely for our sake? It was written for our sake, because the plowman should plow in hope and the thresher thresh in hope of a share in the crop. If we have sown spiritual good among you, is it too much if we reap your material benefits? If others share this rightful claim upon you, do not we still more? Nevertheless, we have not made use of this right, but we endure anything rather than put an obstacle in the way of the Gospel of Christ.

THE GOSPEL

(For the Eleventh Sunday of Matthew)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (18:23-35)

The Lord spoke this parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the reckoning, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents; and as he could not pay, his lord ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him the lord of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But that same servant, as he went out, came upon one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and seizing him by the throat he said, 'Pay what you owe.' So his fellow servant fell down and besought him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' He refused and went and put him in prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their lord all that had taken place. Then his lord summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you besought me; and should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his lord delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. So also My heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."

THE SYNAXARION

On August 24 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the holy Martyr Eutyches, disciple of John the Theologian and Paul the Apostle.

Verses

Prosperously hast thou prospered, prosperity's namesake; With God as thy portion, O Eutyches, hast thou prospered. On the twenty-fourth, a stone hid Eutyches.

Though not numbered among the Seventy Apostles, Eutyches is also called an apostle because he was a disciple of the great apostles and he displayed true apostolic zeal in his evangelical service. Consecrated a missionary bishop, Eutyches traveled much, having an angel as his companion. In prison, he received heavenly bread from an angel. When his body was scraped with a serrated iron rod, blood flowed from him with unusual fragrant myrrh. Eutyches was thrown into a fire and before wild beasts and finally beheaded with a sword in Sebastopol, where he had been born. He now resides with the Apostles in the Heavenly Kingdom.

On this day, we also commemorate the New Hieromartyr Cosmas Aitolos, equal-to-the-Apostles and evangelizer of southern Albania.

TIMES TO CROSS ONESELF: +WHEN THE Holy Trinity (FATHR, SON AND HOLY SPIRIT) IS MENTIONED.

- +When entering or leaving the Church (Sancuary)
 - +At <u>beginning of Liturgy.</u>
 +When passing infront of the Altar (whether in front or back of the Church).
 - +When <u>venerating an Icon, the Gospel or Cross</u>, and at the times for personal petitions
 - +When receiving Communion but before reaching the chalice as to not bump it.
 - *Prior to communion, <u>one should venerate the Icon, have arms folded</u>
 <u>across the chest, right over left</u> and let the arms free to bend near to
 receive the Sacrament
 - *Those <u>asking for a blessing during communion should say, "Bless Father" and bow the head</u> as the priest will hold the chalice over one's head in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
 - *Kissing the Chalice is not required but if done, should be done carefully.
 - *NOTE: Communion is only for Orthodox prepared by prayer, fasting, and recent confession.

I AM NOT WORTHY

T. JOHN THE BAPTIST played a vital role in the story of salvation for the human race. The son of Zacharias and Elizabeth, John lived his adult life as a recluse in the Judean wilderness. It had been foretold that ". . . he would be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. And he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God." (Luke 1:15-16) It is no wonder then that many who heard him preach and came to the Jordan River to be baptized by him thought that he might be the long-awaited Messiah.

John, however, never lost sight of what his calling was. He had no "illusions of grandeur", for he fully understood that he was to be the "Forerunner of Christ" - the one who would prepare the world for the coming of the Savior. He was the "voice of one crying in the wilderness." Yes, John made it perfectly clear to all those who listened to his words: "There comes One after me who is mightier than I. I am not worthy to undo the strap of His sandal." (Mark 1:7) After baptizing Jesus - something that he thought himself unworthy to do - John was content to fade into the background and allow our Lord to begin His redemptive work.

As Christ embarked upon His Divine Mission, John continued to preach the message of repentance to all who would listen. Never afraid to speak the truth, John was arrested and cast into prison for criticizing King Herod for his adulterous relationship with his brother's wife Herodias. This eventually would lead to his execution by means of beheading.
